

Crochet Scalloped Bunting

You can use any yarn and hook combo that you like. I chose yarn from my stash and used the different hooks to ensure that my scallops were the same size. Here's what I used:

- Beige – Stitch Nation/ Full O' Sheep in Little Lamb using hook size H8/5mm
- Hot Pink – Stitch Nation/ Bamboo Ewe in Snapdragon using hook size I9/5.5 mm
- Red – LionBrand Wool Ease using hook size H8/5mm
- Soft Pink – Caron 100% acrylic using hook size G6/4.25 mm

Scallops or Half Circles:

- Round 1 – Make a magic ring , ch 3, 5 dc in ring (6 dc) ,tightly pull the ring closed, ch 3 and turn
- Round 2 – dc in same ch 3 st, 2 dc in each st across (12 dc), ch 3 and turn
- Round 3 – 2 dc in next st, *dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, repeat from * across (18 dc), ch 3 and turn

- Round 4 – dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, *dc in next 2 st, 2 dc in next st, repeat from * across (24 dc), ch 3 and turn
- Round 5 – (when using the soft pink and beige yarn replace the dc with hdc in this row) dc in next 2 st, 2 dc in the next st, *dc in next 3 st, 2 dc in next st (30 dc), repeat from * across
- Fasten off and sew in loose ends

Make 2 half circles in each color

Connecting the half circles:

- Using the red yarn, make a slip knot and chain 10
- Insert hook in the first stitch of the flat side of the red half-circle
- Slip stitch all the way across the flat side – you may have to fudge a few stitches – as evenly as you can
- Chain 1 and attach the next half-circle following the directions above
- Continue attaching the half-circles with a ch 1 in between each on
- Chain 11 after the last half-circle and turn
- Single Crochet in the top loop of each slip stitch all the way across the bunting careful no to twist it
- Once you reach the end fasten off, sew in loose ends, hang and enjoy!
